Message from the Jamaica Environment Trust (JET)

International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) Day 2022, celebrated on September 17, continued to see renewed interest from many. A total of 6,020 volunteers from 134 groups collected 79,507 pounds of garbage from 124 miles of coastline at 158 cleanups across all 14 parishes. This is a significant increase from ICC 2021, where 1,600 volunteers collected over 37,000 pounds of garbage. In 2022, ICC also saw the return of JET's flagship cleanup at the Palisadoes Go-Kart Track in Kingston, after a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic. JET's cleanup was Jamaica's largest ICC cleanup, with over 1,100 volunteers from corporate groups, schools, service clubs, and Community Based Organisations (CBO) who turned out and removed 6,390 pounds of garbage from the coastline. The increase in volunteers in 2022 continues to demonstrate that environmental awareness is present, and we are on our way back to pre-pandemic levels of participation.

Data collected during ICC Day 2022 reveals that plastic waste remains a significant problem on Jamaica's coastlines, with plastic beverage bottles and bottle caps being the most commonly collected items for the 15th year in a row. The prevalence of plastic and foam debris highlights the need for better waste management practices to prevent microplastics from harming marine life. This emphasizes the urgency for individuals, businesses, and governments to take measures to reduce plastic waste and protect our oceans.

JET is grateful to all our ICC Jamaica sponsors for their continued support. 2022 ICC activities would not have been possible without the support of our longstanding donor, TEF and our international partners, the Ocean Conservancy. We also had three new donors Nestle Jamaica, International Ingredients and Versachem International Ltd. We are grateful to all the volunteers who participate in ICC Jamaica every year.
